NEWSDESK

Our last home game saw Alloa drop to a 3-1 defeat against Stenhousemuir. An early corner was directed into the side netting as Aaron Steele put pressure on Dave McKay and the Alloa defender made contact. Miko Virtanen was robbed of the ball in his own half and Michael Anderson chipped a stranded PJ Morrison to double the advantage. Alloa rallied with Luke Donnelly having a headed goal chopped off for offside but just minutes later he would turn creator for Conor Sammon for the Wasps to set up a nervy finish. However a quick Stenhousemuir break that saw a clearly offside Corey O'Donnell chase through and score would put down any chance of a late comeback.

Alloa's next trip was to league leaders Arbroath. The Angus side had corrected early season form issues but found themselves on the back foot until Alloa cut them open through Rankin and O'Donnell saw his effort blocked. The resulting stramash saw Conor Sammon score from an offside position but just sixty seconds later Arbroath would be ahead with a dangerous cross over PJ Morrison unable to be dealt with by the Alloa goalkeeper and all he could do was flap the ball down for Gavin Reilly to give the Red Lichties the lead. This however would not last long as Alloa continued to cause problems with some high tempo attacking. Stefan Scougall

would fire home to level the scores and then just before the break a powerful Luke Rankin shot would give the Wasps the lead. In the second half an early corner was cleared only as far as centre-half Dave McKay and he rattled a shot past Aidan McAdams to double Alloa's advantage. PJ Morrison would pull off a couple excellent saves as Alloa managed the game and took home all three points but it was a really pleasing way to end a run of three straight defeats.



The only negative of the day may well have been a Steven Hetherington injury that saw him withdrawn on 49 minutes. Hopefully he only requires a quick turnaround after recent injury troubles.

Alloa Athletic are sad to lean that former player Andrew Rogerson died on the 9th December 2024 after a short illness. In total Drew made 229 appearances scoring 21 goals in his time at Alloa, making him the 25th most appearances since 1945/46 before moving to Stirling Albion, Albion Rovers, Stenhousemuir and Raith Rovers . Our thoughts and condolences are with Drew's family at this sad time.



2024 ALLOA'S YEAR IN NUMBERS

Although football is typically remembered in seasons rather than calendar years, the Wasps' first home game of 2025 provides the perfect opportunity to wrap up the year that has just passed for Alloa Athletic Football Club. It was another year of highs and lows, with some iovous wins and some crushing defeats, most notably the deja vu play-off defeat to Hamilton Accies for a second successive vear. As has become something of an annual tradition (this will be my 21st successive yearly review for the matchday programme), all the key moments in the year will be recounted through numbers.

20 WINS

The Wasps won a total of 20

games during the calendar year, eclipsing the 18 won in both 2022 and 2023. Those wins were spread evenly between home and away matches and those during the last season and the current campaign. The most common winning scoreline was 1-0, with six separate Alloa wins being by this narrowest of margins. Beyond that, Alloa were also victorious on three separate occasions by scorelines of 3-1 (v Edinburgh, Brechin and Partick) and 3-2 (v Annan, Cove and St Johnstone). For Alloa supporters, the most memorable win was probably the 5-1 annihilation of Stirling Albion at Forthbank. It was the first time ever that Alloa had scored five goals on an away day in Stirling (in 56 games going back to 1948) and the biggest derby victory since the 7-0 thrashing in 1998. With five different scorers and the Wasps dominant against a sorry looking home side, it was a perfect afternoon for the noisy away support and undoubtedly provided one of the moments of the year.

5-0

Alloa's biggest win of 2024 came at the beginning of November, when Annan were trounced 5-0 at the Recs. That game will be best remembered for the two sublime goals from Luke Donnelly either side of half-time, showcasing LD's outstanding natural ability. Some of my favourite wins were closer encounters with dramatic late winners, such as the 3-2 success. at Cove in April (live on BBC Alba with Ethan Sutherland's perfect cross being headed superbly into the far corner by Bobby Wales) to secure Alloa's play-off place and the 3-1 second-half comeback win at Partick Thistle in the SPFL Trust Trophy, when Kevin Cawley rolled back the vears with a magical brace to shock Thistle

5 SUCCESSIVE WINS IN FEBRUARY

Alloa enjoyed a perfect February, winning all five league games to move from 6th to 3rd position in the table. It was the first time the Wasps had won five in a row since 2012 in the Third Division under Paul Hartley. Annan (3-2), Stirling (1-0), Annan (2-1), Cove (4-1) and Hamilton (2-1) were all defeated, leading to Andy Graham being awarded the manager of the month award, with red-hot winger Taylor Steven (4 goals and 2 assists) walking away with the divisional player of the month award too. The confidence and momentum gained from those victories was tremendous to witness.

1 PREMIERSHIP SCALP

The Premier Sports League Cup Group Stages saw St Johnstone return to the Recs for a second successive year. However, unlike the 4-0 Saints victory in 2023, this time around the Wasps stepped up and fully deserved a 3-2 victory against the top tier team. Morgyn Neill's opener (a trademark header) was immediately cancelled out. but two sensational finishes from teenage striker Luke Rankin saw Alloa go into an unassailable 3-1 lead. Although the Saints pulled one back during injury time, the 3-2 Alloa win was the Wasps first over St Iohnstone since 1958!

8 GAMES UNBEATEN START TO THE LEAGUE SEASON

The Wasps enjoyed a positive start to the league season, with the 8 game unbeaten run (3 wins and 5 draws) being Alloa's longest unbeaten start to a league season since 1986. The bedrock of those fine results was a solid defence, with PI Morrison achieving five clean sheets from the opening seven league matches. Alloa actually topped the table after matchdays 6, 7, 10 and 13, marking the first time since October 2016 that the Wasps found themselves at the league summit.

12 GOALS

For the third calendar year running, Conor Sammon topped the goalscoring charts. After scoring a dozen goals in 2022 and fourteen in 2023, the



evergreen Wasps striker proved his worth yet again by bagging another dozen goals in 2024. That tally included match-winning second-half strikes in home victories over Annan, Stenhousemuir and Kelty Hearts. with the former Republic of Ireland international having a wonderful knack of being in the right place at exactly the right time. Sammon also scored an excellent goal in the Scottish Cup defeat at Motherwell (one of Conor's former clubs) and a double at former club Falkirk. when the Wasps came within five minutes of denving Falkirk an invincible season at a sell-out Falkirk Stadium, November's strike against Annan marked the 150th goal of Sammon's distinguished career, which is now in its 21st season. Just behind Sammon on the scoring charts was loanee Bobby Wales with 11 (it is tremendous to see that the Scotland U21 cap is now beginning to regularly start games and make telling contributions back at Kilmarnock). The bronze medal was shared by Taylor Steven (interestingly, the combined ages of Steven

[19] and Wales [18] equalled the age of Sammon [37]!) and Luke Donnelly (both with 9 goals), with Scott Taggart and Luke Rankin just off the podium with 8 goals apiece in 2024. 75% of Taggart's strikes were from the penalty spot, with the ever-reliable captain successful from each of his six spot-kicks during 2024. There were a total of 18 different Alloa goalscorers during the year, with the most surprising being Ion Robertson breaking his almost seven year wait for goal after steering home the winner at Hamilton in Februarv. It turned out to be Robbo's final goal for the club, with his summer release ending eight tremendous seasons service for the club which saw him make 262 appearances and score 5 goals in total.

8 BRACES

Although there were no hattricks by an Alloa player in 2024 (Alloa's last hat-trick hero was Conor Sammon at Buckie Thistle in July 2022), there were 8 separate braces scored by Wasps in 2024. Bobby Wales bagged two separate doubles, in the away wins at Annan and Cove. Last season Taylor Steven also scored a double against Cove (Steven was unplayable that damp February afternoon at the Recs), Scott Taggart scored the first double of his career in the 5-2 away win at Edinburgh and Conor Sammon scored two first half goals in that eventual 2-2 draw at Falkirk. This season's braces have already been mentioned elsewhere in this article (Rankin v St Johnstone, Cawley at Partick and Donnelly v Annan).

2 PENALTY SAVES

While Scott Taggart had a 100% success rate from the spot for a second calendar year running for Alloa, at the other end of the pitch the Wasps conceded 5 penalties during 2024. Of those, PJ Morrison was a full stretch to pull off fine saves to deny Motherwell's Blair Spittal and Arbroath's Thomas O'Brien. Docherty of Annan, Spencer of Falkirk and Wallace of Dumbarton all converted their penalties against the Wasps, but none of those games finished in Alloa defeats, whereas when Morrison did perform heroics to keep the penalty out, Alloa were still beaten on both occasions!

6/1-RED CARD COUNT

To continue a theme experienced in 2023 (3 red cards in 44 matches), there was a refreshing lack of red cards during Alloa matches in 2024, with only 7 dismissals during the 50 matches played. In 2023 all 3 red-cards were for Alloa players, with that almost being repeated in 2024, with 6 of the 7 dismissals being for those in the gold and black of Alloa (McKay, Cawley, Neill, Donnelly, Waters and McDonnell). The single time the Wasps had the advantage of playing against ten men was in the final 26 minutes of Alloa's eventual 3-2 success over St Johnstone, after Aaron Essel's ordering-off for violent conduct. With that dismissal being in a cup match. Alloa are now on a run of 77 league matches of the opposition not having a player dismissed, stretching back to Stephen Hendrie's 86th minute red-card for dissent in Alloa's 5-1 victory over Oueen of the South in November 2022. I have no idea whether that run is any kind of record, but bearing in mind the Wasps have endured 10 separate red cards in that time, I can speculate that it might be!



72% WIN & DRAW RATE

The home draw with Dumbarton at the beginning of December saw Andy Graham clock up his half-century of games in charge of the Wasps. In the past 30 years only Terry Christie's Alloa side were tougher to beat than Andy's in their respective first 50 games in charge of the Wasps, with Graham's 72% win and draw rate eclipsing the records of Billy Lamont (68%), Tom Hendrie's two spells (60% & 56%), Allan Maitland (58%), Barry Smith (44%), Jim Goodwin (62%), Peter Grant (56%), Brian Rice (66%), level with Paul Hartley and just behind Christie (78%). When calculating matters purely on a more conventional win-rate metric. Andv's win percentage (42%) was only bettered by Hartley (52%), Rice (50%) and Christie (46%), which reflects well on Andy's first 50 games in management.

49 APPEARANCES

With the exception of the December Stirlingshire Cup tie, captain Scott Taggart started every single game for the Wasps in 2024 (unsurprisingly more than any other Alloa player). Taggart's durability is exceptional, with it being notable that Andy Graham has employed his captain at his natural right-back berth as much as possible. Previous Alloa managers continuously switched Taggart to either centre-back or left-back, but Graham has consciously resisted that temptation as much as possible. In 2024 Taggart starting 43 games at right-back and just 6 in central defence. Ironically, in the very first game of 2025 last weekend Taggart was moved across to left-back in the pleasing victory at Arbroath. As always, Taggs stuck to his task with determination and skill, successfully nullifying the Red Lichties dangerman Scott Stewart, as all Andy Graham's tactical tweaks worked to perfection. Taggart is currently on a run of 67 successive starts (excluding the 'Shire Cup), stretching back to August 2023.

13 CLEAN SHEETS

Alloa kept thirteen clean sheets in 2024, which is an improvement on the 12 achieved in 2023 and 10 earned in 2022. PJ Morrison kept 11 of those clean sheets, with the very capable Tochukwu Ogayi being in goal for the other two. It is a real strength of Andy Graham's squad to have two very able goalkeepers, with both impressing during 2024.

On the other side of the coin. the Wasps failed to score in a total a 12 games during 2024. Interestingly, the Wasps failed to score on 8 occasions at the Recs in 2024 (split equally between last season and this campaign), with Alloa only drawing a blank on 4 occasions in away matches. All of those occurrences have come this season, starting with the late August goalless draw at Arbroath and more recently in defeats at Dunfermline. Inverness and Cove. This followed a trend of the Wasps being a bit more expansive on the road in 2024, with 47 goals scored in away games, far exceeding the 35 scored in the same number of games (25) at the Recs.

LATE GOAL SPECIALISTS

Prior to the turn of the year, during the 2024/25 season, the Wasps scored a disproportionally high amount of goals late in games. 17 of the 38 goals scored this season prior to last weekend's game versus Arbroath had come in the final 20 minutes of matches. That total matched the total number of goals scored in the first 60 minutes of those same matches, which also totalled 17! That's a kind of stat that you can draw several different conclusions from, but I prefer the positive spin of it signalling Alloa being late goal specialists.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE MILESTONES

Throughout 2024 a number of Alloa players passed various personal appearance milestones. Most recently Scott Taggart capped his 350th Alloa appearance with a goal in the December victory at Kelty Hearts. Conor Sammon made his 150th Alloa appearance that day too, with that same feat being achieved a week earlier away at Dumbarton in the cup by Stefan Scougall. Skilful Scouggs marked the occasion with a finely struck goal, albeit in defeat for the Wasps. That very same night Stevie Hetherington also clocked up his 250th Alloa appearance and marked it with a customary vellow card! In August Cammy O'Donnell joined the 100 club (becoming the first youth academy graduate to do so for 15 years in the process). In

terms of whole career appearances, Scougall passed the 400 mark in July, Taggart clocked up 500 in July and Kevin Cawley remarkably made it to 600 in October (also congratulations to Kevin for beginning 2025 with his landmark 500th Alloa appearance in last weekend's victory at Arbroath). At the other end of the scale, a series of players either made their first senior career appearances in 2024 (Reece Mullen, Shav Nevans and Kane Thomson), or scored their first career goals in senior football during 2024, namely Ethan Sutherland and Kane Thomson (ironically both were scored in separate games against Montrose).

2024 delivered some magical moments which will be remembered for decades to come, particular in the later months of the 2023/24 season, as the Wasps chased promotion with an exciting brand of front-foot football. After such a promising start to the new year last weekend at Arbroath, my fingers are crossed the current Alloa team can create some more wonderful memories for supporters in 2025 too.

PLAYER FROM THE PAST - SCOT BUIST

Scot Buist signs from Oakley United - May 2007

Alloa Athletic signed defender Scot Buist from Oakley United for an undisclosed fee, manager Allan Maitland had tracked Scot after being alerted to his progress by Oakley player/manager and ex Alloa Athletic captain, Willie Newbigging.

Scot had begun his footballing career as a youngster with Glasgow Rangers but was farmed out to Stenhousemuir. Whilst at Ochilview this time Scot was put out on loan to Oakley United where he soon showed his worth.

At the start of Season 2007/08 Alloa manager Allan Maitland gave him his chance to play for his first senior club. Scot struck up an excellent defensive partnership at Recreation Park with Chris Townsley and later in his spell with "The Wasps" also played alongside Sandy Hodge, Fraser Forrest and Dougie Hill.

The Dublin-born defender began his paying career at Blackburn Rovers but is most known in his playing days for his 12-year stint at Carlisle United, Murphy has become a Carlisle favourite because of his upbeat personality, and his record for most games of any outfield player in the club's history. The capped Irishman first stepped into management with Annan in League 2. After multiple individual awards, Murphy guided hi side to promotion in May 2023 with a play-off triumph





against Clyde. Last season he consolidated the club's status in Annan as they impressed particularly at the end of the season with their performances. Queens supporters will be hoping the experienced head of Murphy will be enough to guide them to loftier heights by the end of the season.

THE CAPTAIN – MATTY DOUGLAS

Matty Douglas will continue to lead the team with the armband following his appointment of captain in the summer. A natural leader off the park, Douglas also leads by example with his determination and grit in defending his box. Douglas is well known to Murphy having also made the move from Galabank to Palmerston this summer, signing a 2-year deal earlier this summer. Prior to Annan, where he was part of the successful promotion side, Douglas spent time at Workington AFC and Carlisle United's academy. The 26-year-old has been present in all bar two of Queen's fixtures this season. Having not only added defensive stability, he has also d=chipped in with goals against rivals, Annan Athletic, and league leaders, Arbroath.

ONE TO WATCH – MICHAEL HEWITT

This afternoon's one to watch was also last Saturday's matchwinner in the form of Michael Hewitt. The 24-year-old right back began his career in the Rangers academy which saw him earn a transfer to Ayr United. Following loan spells at Kilwinning Rangers, Annan Athletic and Peterhead, he eventually departed Somerset Park permanently to sign for Hamilton Accies. After a year at Accies, Hewitt made the switch to Palmerston in the summer and has been an ever present throughout the campaign. Not only providing energy on the right hand side of defence, Hewitt has contributed across the campaign on the goal front. Having found the net four times against Cove Rangers, Kelty Hearts and Dumbarton, he is the club's joint top scorer despite playing right back.

THE CONNECTION

There are a few returning faces to the Indodrill today and we welcome them all back gladly. The first of those is left-back, Daniel Church. After coming on leaps and bounds under Brian Rice, Church earned the move last summer back to full-time

The return fixture was once again a close one with the teams yet again being locked in a draw. This time it was young Luke Rankin who opened the scoring the Wasps in the second half. That lead would be short lived though as Josh Walker equalised for the hosts just six minutes later. The league table and previous results suggest and prove that whatever happens today, it will be a closely fought affair.

But each time they went ahead they were pegged back, through an Andy Seaton double from the penalty spot and a late Steve Thomson header.

Despite their fighting display,

Wasps are still without a home win this season and remain rooted to the foot of the table. Terry Christie's men started brightly, with loan signing Robert Sloan showing some nice early touches. Indeed, they were unlucky not to have taken the lead inside three minutes when Gareth Hutchison's header from a Seaton corner crashed off the bar.

However, their early good work was undone in eight minutes as O'Neill headed Queens in front from Brian McLaughlin's cross. Wasps hit back two minutes later when Queens defender Jim Thomson pulled back Ryan Davidson in the box and Seaton drove home the spot kick. Steve Bowey then tested home keeper Myles Hogarth in 18 minutes before the Dumfries men regained the lead three minutes later.

Andy Aitken charged down the wing and found O'Neill, who neatly chested the ball for Weatherson to blast home from 20 yards. Queens threatened again in 34 minutes as Weatherson collected Steve Renicks' pass, only to fire into the sidenetting. It proved a costly miss as Alloa drew level just before the break, thanks to a second penalty. Andy Aitken hauled down Ross Hamilton and Seaton again converted. Seaton was proving a real thorn in the visitors' side. His in-swinging corners were causing Queens all sorts of bother, with Eric Paton heading one off the line and fellow defender Steven Thomson nodding another off the bar.

Kevin Cawley broke through another milestone with Alloa Athletic FC at the weekend as Alloa Athletic defeated Arbroath 3- 1 at the Greenversity Stadium at Gayfield, Arbroath.

Kevin has now made 500 games for the club, scoring 80 goals.

When he came on as second half substitute for Stefan Scougall after 72 minutes against Arbroath at Gayfield on Saturday 4th January, 2025 making it his 500th game for the club.

However, this is not the full story with Kevin already made 111 appearances and scoring 19 goals with other clubs in the Scottish League. So, he is now on 500 + 111 appearances in the Scottish League = 611

Also scoring 80 goals for Alloa + 19 for other Scottish Clubs = 99 goals

Kevin was born on 17th March 1989 and is now 35 years old, he began as a Youth with Glasgow Celtic where he represented Scottish Youth's U16 in 2004/05, when he played 6 matches. Then again in 2005/06 for Scotland Youth's U17 when he played another 6 matches, and lastly 2007/08 he played 3 matches for Scotland U17's. While with Celtic, when Gordon Strachan was the manager, Kevin was also in the Celtic Youth side which were runners up twice in the Youth Cup final in 2007 & 2008.

In 2009/10 Celtic sent Kevin out on loan to Ayr United where he made 15 appearances under Brian Reid. In the second half of 2009/10 season Kevin moved to Stranraer where he made 15 appearances under guidance of ex Alloa Athletic player Keith Knox. At the start of Season 2010/11 he joined East Stirling where he made 42 appearances and scored 14 goals under guidance of Jim McInally.

Then at the start of **SEASON 2011/12** Kevin was to join up

with Paul Hartley who he had know at his time with Celtic and he has never looked back.

SEASON 2011/12 winning promotion as Champions from the Third Division

SEASON 2012/13 winning Promotion again, this time through the Play-Off, where the defeated Dunfermline Athletic in the two legged final to gain back-to-back promotion.

Season 2013/14 finished 8th in Championship

SEASON 2014/15 finished 9th but won the Play Off v. Forfar Athletic

SEASON 2015/16 Kevin was left unsure of his future with manager Danny Lennon going off on holiday, Stevie Aitken stepped in and took Kevin Cawley & Mark Docherty to Dumbarton.

SEASON 2016/17 Jack Ross then brought back Kevin from Dumbarton, however Jack Ross was to move to St. Mirren in October 2016 while Jim Goodwin then took over the managers role. Again, the club reached the Play off final but lost agonisingly to Brechin City on Penalties.



SEASON 2017/18 the again reached the Play Off final v. Dumbarton where Jim Goodwin went one better than last season by winning promotion after defeating Dumbarton in the final.

SEASON 2018/19 went to the final game of the season when Alloa managed to secure 8th position with QOS & Falkirk

being relegated.

SEASON 2019/20 was a difficult season due to the corona virus pandemic, the season being cut short, finishing on 12th March 2020 with Alloa in eighth place in the division.

SEASON 2020–21 was even more difficult, again the season been reduced to 27 games, not beginning until October 2020,

but all games had to be played behind closed doors due to players and fans having to isolate. Sadly, the club were also to lose one of their finest midfield player Ian Flannigan who decided this is not how he wanted to play football. The club finished bottom of the league and were relegated.

Season 2021-22 Sadly, Peter Grant decided a change was needed and he left the club with Barry Ferguson taking over the manager's job, but it just didn't work, therefore Brian Rice was appointed on 21st February 2022 and managed to get the club to finish 5th in the League which earlier in the season did not look possible.

SEASON 2022–23 Brian Rice would lead "The Wasps" again into the Play-Off's where he met one of his old clubs Hamilton Accies, which proved to be a game too far for Alloa cruelly losing 5-3 on aggregate with Alloa struggling due to injury & fatigue. Kevin himself married Gillian 1st July, 2022.

SEASON 2023-24 Brian Rice began the season as manager but was tempted to a full-time

management position with Livingston. Andy Graham, another Alloa legend took over the managerial positioput up a great display n, but still never closed the door on making more appearances for the club. At the start of Season 2023-24 Kevin Cawley was rewarded with a testimonial on 24th June 2023, the match ended 2-2 with Kevin Cawley scoring the goal of the game. By the end of the season Alloa Athletic finished 3rd in the League and another Play-Off fixture against Hamilton Accies again, unfortunately "The Wasps" put up a great display but went down 5-4. Kevin's son Luca was born on 4th January 2024.

SEASON 2024-25 Kevin once again this season has featured very much in the manager's plans, Andy Graham said "Kevin has been regenerated after starting a new job, getting married and his wife Gillian giving birth to his son Luca all in the past two years. In a season which highlights the importance of combining experience & youth."

WHAT WAS SAID ABOUT KEVIN:



Paul Hartley recalled "He was a terrific signing for me... I loved working with him... he's been a brilliant servant to Alloa and I really can't speak highly enough of him".

Jack Ross noted on bringing Kevin back from his season at Dumbarton that he'd been a long-time admirer of his, while Jim Goodwin quipped that we could all do with more Kevin Cawley's, before adding "He is a pleasure for me as a young manager to work with and the boys love him."

Peter Grant was another who always praised 'KC', recalling in his time, "he was a great player for me, it was a joy and pleasure to work with him and I really enjoyed it."

Cawley's team-mates have always appreciated his efforts, with some of his long-term colleagues undoubtedly best placed to place on record their admiration for Wee Kev, seeing him on-and-off the pitch for so long.

Stevie Hetherington explained, "He demands high standards, he's a top, top player. He's such a hard-working player too, someone you really appreciate... He's been a great servant to the club, he's had a lot of success."

Captain at the time before taking up the managers role, Andy Graham added "His attitude to everything is brilliant; the way he looks after himself off the pitch. He's one of the most unassuming people that you'll meet. I can't talk highly enough of him and as a person off the pitch, in the dressing room he's brilliant, he's a funny wee guy. He deserves all the plaudits he gets for the quality he's brought to Alloa."
